[setting it up]

What barriers did Jesus break through in order to minister to the centurion and heal his servant?

What barriers did Jesus break through in order to minister to the widow and her son?

How is compassion a factor in Christ's efforts to minister to these people in need?

Although we do not see a profession of faith in these verses, how do they fit into Jesus's overall strategy to "seek and save the lost"?

Brainstorm for a couple of minutes about barriers we experience when it comes to being more effective in seeking out the lost.

- your LifeGroup?
- us as a church?
