#### [set up]

Describe one of the biggest acts of faith that God has called you to recently or in the past.

How did you know it was the Lord, and what was the outcome/reward of taking that risk in faith and obedience?

#### [digging deeper]

This last weekend we looked at the risk-taking actions that Abraham took when the Lord initially called him. What was something that stood out to you from the message or that the Lord impressed on you due to the message?

**Read the following Scripture passages**: Genesis 11:27-12:7; Acts 7:2-4; Hebrews 11:8. Write down as many observations as you can regarding the risks God was calling Abraham to take. Which of the risks that Abraham was called to take would be easiest for you and which one would be the most difficult? Explain your thoughts to your LifeGroup.

How do we see the Gospel of Christ demonstrated even as early as the life of Abraham? Read the following verses to help elaborate: Galatians 3:7-9, 29 and John 8:56.
