[setup]

Do you have any stories related to seeing God work in the lives of those you are praying for or sharing the Gospel with who do not know the Lord?

Start this time by taking out a piece of paper (or if in a LifeGroup, a large post it note, whiteboard, or mutual piece of paper with one person writing for the group) and take five minutes to write down as many descriptions of heaven that you can come up with.

[digging deeper]

As we continue in our series on the afterlife, the topic of the heaven was addressed last weekend. The hope for some type of "heaven" is fairly universal with the exception of theology influenced by atheism. God is not silent on heaven in His Word nor is He exhaustive in its description.

How would you answer the question, "What makes heaven, heaven?"

The following quote from Pastor Tim Keller was mentioned Sunday. What are your thoughts on it? How is it different than most people would typically describe heaven?

"When the Bible speaks of the new heaven and the new earth, it is not speaking of an alternative to this world; it is speaking of the healing and restoration of this world."
