[set up]

Why do so many Christians not have an understanding of the connection between Judaism and Christianity?

What is one question that you have about Israel, Jews, and the Christian faith? (Consider submitting this question for the Romans teaching panel on 8/30 to connect@cvconline.org)

[digging deeper]

Volumes have been written on the relationship Israel has to the church and to God's plan of salvation. There are a few dominant views that vary in where they land, but when you look at Romans 11, do you conclude that God is finished with Israel and has severed them from His plans and promises? What verses stand out to support your view?

Read 1 Kings 19, which the Apostle Paul speaks to in Romans 11:2-5. How does what God did with Elijah mirror what God is doing today with Israel?

How has salvation come to Gentiles (non-Jews) through the trespass of the Jews? (Rom. 11:11)

What can we learn about the concept of global redemption from Romans 11? See Revelation 7:9 for a sneak peek at what's to come because of what we see in Romans 11.

How can God use Gentile salvation to provoke Israel to jealousy? What is God's plan for that jealousy? Can you think of a modern analogy that communicates this big idea well? How is that jealousy an act of grace by God?

How does the grafting metaphor help you understand God's strategy of salvation and personally encourage you? (Rom. 11:17-24)

Review Rom. 11:33-36. If you notice, the tone and cadence of the Apostle Paul changes. He breaks out into praise of God. What do you think prompted that? What are one or two really rich theological "nuggets" that come out of this doxology in the final verses of Romans 11?

Understanding that God's promises to Israel (although delayed at this time) will be fulfilled, how does this help encourage you as you think about God's faithfulness and Scriptural promises in your life?

[living it out]

Do a little research on Judaism and the hope the Jewish people have for a Messiah. As you study, pray for Jewish people and for Israel – especially if you have any friends who are Jewish – that God would open their eyes, ears, and hearts to see Yeshua (Jesus) as God's Messiah. They do not have to wait for someone who has already come!
