Missions Prayer Focus this week: Care on the Square

[set up]

[digging deeper]

Today, we encounter one of the most difficult teachings from Jesus. Open to Luke 6:27-36 and read it together.

Share your immediate thoughts or gut reaction.

Is the command from Jesus to "love our enemy" even humanly possible?

Can you think of a few examples of when you have seen this lived out well?

Jesus gives us three practical ways we can love our enemy, what are they?

Look at King David's response to his enemies in Psalm 69:22-28 (one of several Psalms of this tone).

Look at the Apostle Paul's reaction to being struck in Acts 23:1-3.

How is it encouraging to see how even godly men in Scripture struggled with the reality of living this out?

How would you apply this teaching to the following topics:

- Abusive relationships?
- Self Defense?

- Military and war?
- Passivity?

(You can form smaller groups for each topic and give them 5-10 minutes to come up with a small presentation on the topics.)
