

# **SERMON STUDY GUIDE**

Week of 9.24.23 Exodus 3 // Pastor Rick Duncan

Please note that this guide does not need to be used as-is. Please view the items below as a toolbox as opposed to a road map. You don't have to follow these steps exactly in order or for the allotted amount of time to have a successful LifeGroup study. You may not even have time to get through all of the questions. However, we do think this is pretty good stuff and we hope it's helpful.

# EXPLORE (45 MIN)

# Create Context (10 min):

- 1. Read Exodus chapter 3 out loud together.
- 2. Watch the weekly sermon recap video <u>HERE</u> (4:07)

# Study & Discussion (40 min)

- In Exodus chapter 3, God speaks to Moses from a burning bush. What other passages or stories in Scripture depict God speaking through, or being within, the element of fire?
  - Why do you think God appears as the element of fire at all? As what other elements or in what other ways does God appear to His people throughout the Old Testament?
  - Read Hebrews 1:1-4. How does God speak to His people (Christians) today, and in what specific ways is this different from the manner in which He spoke to Moses?
- In his sermon, Pastor Rick said that God is holy, and therefore we should not approach Him casually. Pastor Rick also said that God desired to be close with Moses and to partner with Moses in friendship. Read Hebrews 10:19-23. Based on the sermon and the passage you just read in Hebrews, consider the following: in our relationship with God, how can we balance an intimate and knowing relationship with fear and reverence before His holiness?
- Moses lived as a prince in Egypt for 40 years. Then he was in Midian as a shepherd for another 40 years before God spoke to Him in the burning bush. Pastor Rick mentioned in his sermon that when we study the life of Moses, we find a God who is not always in a hurry. Based on Pastor Rick's sermon, why do you think that God waited until Moses was in his 80s to bring him back to Egypt to call God's people out of slavery?
  - How should we respond when we face suffering in our own lives and it feels like God is not in a hurry? What does it really look like to wait faithfully and patiently upon the Lord?
- Read Exodus 34:6-7. Where do you see these same attributes of God displayed in Exodus 3 (hint: see verses 7-8, and remember what Pastor Rick mentioned about God seeing, hearing, and knowing the afflictions of His people)?
- Are you ever tempted to think that the God who saw, heard, knew, and cared about the afflictions and sufferings of the Israelites is blind or uncaring to the afflictions and sufferings in your life? Why or why not?

## **Heavy Lifting**

■ NOTE TO LEADERS: If you don't have time to study this in your LifeGroup, encourage LifeGroup members to take some time to read the article below and study this topic on their own during the week.



In Exodus chapter 3, we see the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob revealing Himself by name to His people in a unique way. God revealed Himself in person (first to Moses in the burning bush, and later to the Israelite people through Moses) in what Rick Duncan referred to as an example of Christophany (please read the article linked below). God also revealed Himself in name - telling Moses, "I am who I am," and telling Moses to let the Israelites know that "I am has sent me to you."

- Why is it important or significant that God revealed Himself both in name and in person to Moses and to the Israelite people?
- Have you ever heard the phrase "Christophany" before? Why is it significant that the angel of the Lord in Exodus 3 is a revelation of the Son of God that comes before the life and ministry of Jesus in the New Testament?
- Refer to Hebrews 1:1-4. How are the person and work of Jesus Christ unique as a revelation of God to mankind?

Pray for the list often and hold one another accountable to share the good news as the Holy Spirit provides and prompts. This week, make sure to take some time to pray specifically for the places of suffering and affliction in the lives of group members.
