[setting it up]

Who is someone that has mentored you in your faith—a “Paul” in your life? What is one way God really used them to help grow you or one lesson that they taught you that has impacted you greatly?

[digging deeper]

After attending Sunday’s worship gathering or watching online, what was one take away from the message that stood out to you?

Read Titus 2:1-6.

What do these verses teach us about God?

In Titus 2:2-6, men and women are given a set of biblical living characteristic traits. Stop at each one and briefly define them.

Which ones are the same from those two lists and which ones are distinct to men and women? Why the distinctions?

Which character traits do we see people struggle with in our American culture?

Make sure everyone has either a pen and paper or a digital note app. Someone set a timer for 30 seconds. When you start the timer, everyone starts writing down a list of people in the Bible that seemed to have a mentoring relationship (write the name of the person who was the mentor and the name of their mentee). At the end of 30 seconds, review the names together as a group and compare notes. Give a fun prize to the person who had the longest list.

What are the dangers of not having someone mentoring/disciplining you?

What are the dangers of not mentoring/disciplining someone else?

As you scan Titus 2:1-6 again, what is our greatest motivation to live as instructed in these verses and to teach others in the ways of Christ? What does that mean? How do we see that taking place today in culture? How does Biblical living help offset it?

[living it out]
