SUNDAY SCHOOL AT HOME

Not able to attend church in person this week? We've put together a lesson plan so you can have Sunday School at home. The basic concepts are listed on the left, and some activities are printed below. We would also encourage you to use the Parent Cue for extension activities throughout the month. Remember that doing these specific activities isn't what matters, but leading your child spiritually does matter very much. These are simply tools that we are offering to help you step into or continue on in the role God has given you as a parent.

1. Prepare for the Bible Story

Gather something special to use while you sing and dance. It can be a maraca, a scarf to wave, a pot to beat like a drum... Play an upbeat, fun song your child likes. Tell your child there is only one of the item you chose, so you will have to take turns using it when you sing and dance. Play the song and share the item, back and forth. Say, "Jesus said we can share even if we only have a little bit."

2. Read the Bible Story

Pray with your child, asking God to help him/her understand. Read the Bible story directly from Mark 12, or you can use *The Beginner's Bible*, which has the story on page 433.

3. Worship with Song

At cvconline.org/cvckids, click the link for the Preschool playlist. Play "I Can See," and sing and dance along.

4. Practice the Memory Verse

Open the Preschool Parent Cue at cvconline.org/cvckids. Check out the Memory Verse for this month. Teach your child the verse with the motions.

5. Review the Bible Story

Retell the story of the widow's mite. Make a container represent the offering box; leave it empty. Make another container the widow's bag; put two coins in it. Make a last container a rich man's bag; add a handful of coins. Use the props to retell the story, showing how the rich people still had money left over after they gave some to God and how the woman gave ALL she had by putting her two coins in the empty container.
