How would you explain/define God's grace?

List what the Grace of God has brought us from what you see in this passage:

God's grace and salvation have empowered us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and lawless deeds. Brainstorm a list of worldly desires with your LifeGroup. After you have built your list, as a declaration of praise, select one from the list that you have personally experienced victory over due to God's grace and salvation.
