## SUNDAY SCHOOL AT HOME

Not able to attend church in person this week? We've put together a lesson plan so you can have Sunday School at home. The basic concepts are listed on the left, and some activities are printed below. We would also encourage you to use the Parent Cue for extension activities throughout the month. Remember that doing these specific activities isn't what matters, but leading your child spiritually does matter very much. These are simply tools that we are offering to help you step into or continue on in the role God has given you as a parent.

### 1. Prepare for the Bible Story

Blow bubbles in the air and pretend they are snowflakes. Encourage your child to make a pretend snow angel on the floor. Be sure not to get bubbles in your child's eyes! If it's snowing outside, head out and make real snow angels! Then, explain that there is an angel in today's Bible story.

### 2. Watch the Bible Story

Visit cvconline.org/cvckids. Pray with your child, asking God to help him/her understand. Watch the "Weekly Preschool Bible Story Video."

## 3. Worship with Song

At cvconline.org/cvckids click the link for the Preschool playlist. Play "What Christmas Is About," and sing and dance along.

## 4. Practice the Memory Verse

Open the Preschool Parent Cue at cvconline.org/cvckids. Check out the Memory Verse for this month. Teach your child the verse with the motions. Connect the verse to the Bible story.

## 5. Review the Bible Story

Create a cupcake liner angel.

Gather two white cupcake liners, a gold pipe cleaner, and glue. Fold one liner in half, to make a flat half circle.

Flatten the other liner to make a full circle.

Fold the pipe cleaner in half and make a circle for the head.

Glue the pipe cleaner in the center of the circle liner.

Gently fold both sides of the circle inward and glue in place.

Glue the half circle to the back as wings.
