CONNECT (10 MIN)

In his sermon, Pastor Rick mentioned a self-assessment tool that he built utilizing Exodus 34 (our passage from today). Which of these best describes you and in which do you see room for yourself to grow?

I show mercy, grace, and patience to others, especially when they make mistakes and let me down.

People often feel encouraged as well as challenged after spending time with me, sensing the presence of grace and truth as we interact.

I demonstrate love and loyalty in my relationships by keeping my promises and commitments.

Though I'm very forgiving, others know that I am also just, advocating for what is right even when it's difficult.

I help people have hope in uncertain circumstances because they feel valued in my presence.

EXPLORE (30 MIN)

Study & Discussion (25 min)

- Read Psalm 27:1, John 1:5, James 1:17, John 8:12 and Numbers 6:25. What do these passages tell us about what God is like?
- In his sermon, Pastor Rick said that "what I look at, I will eventually look like." What do you think you are tempted to look at more than you look at Jesus (Your phone? Social media? The television? Your work? Your family?), and what do you think might need to change in your life for you to start looking more and more like Jesus in a significant way?



- 4 Read 2 Corinthians 3:12-18. We'll use this passage to answer the next few questions.
 - Read Exodus 34:30. Moses veiled his face because the Israelites were afraid to come near him as his face shone with the glory of God. Look again at 2 Corinthians 3:13-14. Paul writes that not only was Moses' face veiled, but the Israelites were veiled from understanding the glory of God. Paul states that only Christ can take away this veil of ignorance like the one the Israelites had. What did it look like in your life when Christ "took away the veil of ignorance" and you came to know Him in a saving way? What was your life like before this happened?
 - Read Hebrews 3:1-6. What does this passage tell us about the similarities, and the differences, between Moses and Jesus?
 - Read 2 Corinthians 3:18 once more. Notice how Paul writes that those who know Christ are "being transformed" and that this "comes from the Lord." Why are these statements significant when we think about the gift of our salvation, and when we think about our sanctification (the process by which we become more like Christ)? Do we become Christlike in our own power, or by the power of someone else?

Take some time to pray over these questions on your own, asking the Lord to reveal to you the answers and to help you as you seek to live for Him.
