# **LESSON OVERVIEW**

Know what your child will learn at church, and synch it up at home.

# **SEPTEMBER 21st**

Joshua and Caleb spy the Promised Land (Numbers 13—14)

Basic Truth: **God made me.** 

Key Question: Why should you do what God says? Bottom Line: God knows what's best for me.

# **SEPTEMBER 28th**

Rahab trusts God and helps the spies. (Joshua 2, 6:22-25)

Basic Truths: God loves me.

Key Question: What happens to the people who trust God?

Bottom Line: God takes care of all who trust Him.

# **OCTOBER 5th**

God helps Joshua win the battle of Jericho. (Joshua 6:1-20)

Basic Truths: God loves me.

Key Question: Who always keeps His promises? Bottom Line: God always keeps His promises.

# SIMPLE WAYS TO BRING THE LESSONS HOME...



# **MORNING TIME**

As you greet your preschooler each morning, turn the following statements into a little cheer or chant. Encourage your child to say the cheer with you!

"God made you! God loves you!

Yay, God!"



# **PLAY TIME**

Join your child during play time and help her build a tall tower out of blocks, pillows, or anything you have! March around the tower, and then knock it down together. Repeat! Be sure to end play time by reminding your child about the story of God leading His people to the land He promised them. God knocked down the walls of Jericho, so that the Israelites could live there. God always keeps His promises.



## **DRIVE TIME**

When you are driving, sing a version of the "The Wheels on the Bus." Change out the lyrics, and sing these words instead:

"God keeps His promises

Yes, He does.

Yes. He does.

Yes, He does.

God keeps His promises.

Yes, He does.

Promise-keeping God!"



## **BATH TIME**

Talk to your child about how he can trust you to help him with his bath. He can trust you to help him out of his clothes. He can trust you to make sure the water is the right temperature...not too hot, not too cold. He can trust you to wash his hair and rinse the soap out. What else can he trust you to do? Explain that the One he can trust the MOST is God! Those who trust in God can know He will always take care of them. Rahab trusted God, and God protected her and took care of her during the battle of Jericho. We should trust God like Rahab did, and know He will take care of us, too!



### CUDDI F TIME

Cuddle up with your child and pray. "Dear Father God, We love you and want to always do what you say. Help us to obey what you tell us to do. Help us to be like Joshua and Caleb who believed you and wanted to do things your way. As we trust you, use us to do super things! In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."
