

#### Jesus Cares About All Suffering (vv. 29-34)

Jesus Cares Most About Eternal Suffering (vv. 38-39)

• No one seems to be concerned about what Jesus is teaching, they're more interested in what he's able to do for them immediately.

Jesus didn't come only to address temporary suffering; He came to conquer eternal suffering.

He didn't come only to push back fevers; He came to push back sin and death.

He didn't come only to extend your life by a few decades; He came to give you life forever.

## **PRAYER TARGETS**

#### Pray for those who are suffering right now.

Ask the Father to comfort and heal those in our church family who are battling illness, chronic pain, or emotional burdens. Thank Him that Jesus cares deeply about all suffering and draw near to the hurting with His compassion.

### Pray for faith that endures even when healing doesn't come.

Ask God to strengthen our trust in Christ when prayers seem unanswered. Pray that, like Christy's testimony, we would hold fast to the promise that eternal healing is guaranteed in Jesus, even if it does not come in this life.

#### Pray for clarity about Jesus' mission.

Ask the Spirit to guard us from seeking Jesus only for what He can do for us now. Pray that our hearts would treasure Him as Savior and Lord – the One who came not just to remove temporary pain but to conquer sin, death, and eternal suffering.

### Pray for gospel urgency.

Ask God to awaken in us a deep desire to share the good news of His kingdom with others. Just as Jesus prioritized preaching, pray that we would not keep silent but point others to the eternal hope found in Him.

### Pray for perseverance in prayer and communion with God.

Ask that we, like Jesus, would make prayer a priority in the midst of busyness and need. Pray that our private time with the Father would shape our perspective, deepen our dependence, and align our hearts with His mission.
